Workshop conclusions (1/2)



■ Concrete proposals

- Ensure a mechanism for groups to give feedback on the Spring Alliance manifesto
- Prepare a meeting in October to look at next steps for forming a Spanish Spring Alliance and prepare a common statement for the upcoming Spanish presidency
- Prepare a week of actions in the different Spanish regions on the Spring Alliance manifesto and get feedback from the local level
- Use internet, media and social networks to involve a wider audience
- Call for joint meetings and joint actions between the EU and national level
- Call on EU networks to prepare dissemination materials for schools (on the long term)
- Use Spring Alliance website to highlight good practices at national level

Workshops - conclusions 2/2

- **Other conclusions**
 - Long-term process that needs to start now
 - Clear challenges between civil dialogue and social dialogue
 - Willingness to focus on concrete achievable goals
 - Spring Alliance as an example to form the basis for collaboration of the sectors at national level
 - Feedback to develop the Eastern dimension in the Spring Alliance approach to policies – alongside the North/South dimension
